- Shrubbery in Cae Nant meeting on site Thursday 14th decided to clear an area of shrubbery – Anne kindly offered to relocate some others to be removed.

8.Reports

Cllr Butler:

'On 30 th September 2021 Councillors Parry, Butler and Williams attended a virtual meeting of the Highfield Park Community Group. Also in attendance was the new Managing Director, Seona Wier (who was formerly with the Young Foundations arm of MHC). Niall Kelly (Chief Executive) will continue to be involved with the group as required, but Ms Wier will be the regular contact point.

A number of changes to the management team are proposed, a new Director of Operations has been appointed and the Activities Team strengthened.

They have plans to increase the number of residents in due course, (presently at 82% capacity) subject to the renovation of a building on the site.

Issues discussed included:

Traffic – staff are being reminded during team meetings of their obligations to road safety. Theinduction for new staff members also includes this subject together with other issues raised by the group such as walking routes and litter.

Councillor Parry has met on site with County Council Highways officials who have made a number of suggestions to improve the road safety situation locally.

Parcel Delivery problems: improved signage and the potential for new postcodes for premises within the site are being explored.

Litter: Highfield residents are keen to help.

The meeting was advised of the proposed tree felling work in Llangwyfan Forest scheduled for 2022.

The group was told of the "International Dark Sky" initiative and that officers from Countryside

Services are willing to advise on ways of reducing artificial lighting where it impacts the AONB.'

Cllr Butler was thanked for a very comprehensive report.

Cllr Parry: traffic issues around Llangwyfan – report of meeting between Cllr Parry and B Wilcox Jones

'There are two potential options that should be considered by Highfield Park to reduce the speed of vehicles as they exit their premises onto the public highway.

• The installation of a pre-fabricated speed reduction feature, such as a speed cushion or road hump (Similar to the existing one further up the access road), on the Highfield Park access road in close proximity to its junction with the public highway. This would be a relatively low cost option and support could be provided, by Rosehill Polymers, who have previously worked with DCC.

 \cdot A more costly solution would be to modify the geometry of the Highfield Park access road junction with the public highway. The purpose of this option would be to narrow the junction so that vehicles are forced to reduce their speed when using it. This could be done in such a way that it does not negatively affect access and egress for larger delivery vehicles etc.'

Cllr Parry thanked for a very comprehensive report

- 8. Audit update Clerk had received an e mail from Audit Wales saying that they had been unable to complete many Audits by the end of September and a Statuatory Notice to that affect had been placed on the website to inform everyone of the current situation
- 9. Budget setting 2022 to be discussed at full council
- Future proofing of cocoa rooms should we consider installing video conferencing facilities,full broadband (in hand), make it available as more of a hub for remote working, do we need a lift to the first floor and form a minstrel type gallery – maybe consider asking architect to come up with a concept in readiness for a grant submission
- Land next to cocoa rooms Clerk had received e mail November 2020 confirming that the situation was still in probate uncertainty as to ownership should we re approach and confirm interest in purchasing the land to extend cocoa rooms
- Cae Nant should we be preparing a master plan for cae nant in readiness for any commuted sums or should we be looking at placing play equipment somewhere else – to be discussed at full council
- De fibrillatory do we need extra ones in the village especially in cae nant however the group was advised by Cllr Parry that the Sports Association were looking at the possibility of installing one in cae nant and maybe the community council's role would be to contribute towards the cost – this would ensure that responsibility for future maintenance and replacement would lie elsewhere,

AOB – it was requested that the Llandyrnog Charities Funds, Youth Club Funds and Tyn Llan be shown separately on the financial reports'

11.Cocoa Rooms Broadband update

Although Clerk had spoken to a gentleman Hywel from BT on 07447 930285 who had promised to come back to carry out the final external work this had not been done so the Broadband is not yet live – Clerk to follow up the matter with BT and also Lee Christy at DCC who had been promoting the initiative of installing broadband into community buildings
